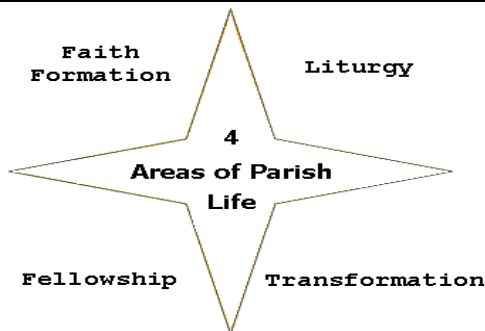

**INSTALLATION OF A BISHOP OR AN ARCHBISHOP – Part 2**

Last week's bulletin included an explanation of the meaning of installation and this week, we find more information on the procedure for the installation. The ceremony on **November 30<sup>th</sup>** will begin at 7:30 p.m. in the back of the church. His Excellency The Most Reverend Pedro López Quintana, Apostolic Nuncio to Canada, will welcome The Most Reverend Durocher in the presence of bishops, priests, and deacons. Together they will form the Entrance Procession.

Once in the chancel, the Apostolic Nuncio will hand the official letter to Most Reverend Durocher from H. H. Benedict XVI nominating him Archbishop of Gatineau. Most Rev. Durocher will then present the letter to the College of Consultors who will give it to the Chancellor of the Archdiocese so that it can be read publicly to the assembly. The Apostolic Nuncio will then proceed with the ascent to the cathedra, or, in other words, will lead the new Archbishop to his seat and "in-stall" him. Representatives from various religious and lay groups in attendance will be invited to come and extend their congratulations. After the "Gloria", the ceremony will follow the usual ritual of the mass. Most Reverend Durocher will be the main celebrant, while members of the clergy in attendance will concelebrate as well as the three suffragan Bishops acting as main concelebrants. One of the highlights of the ceremony will be Most Reverend Durocher's homily, his first public address as Archbishop of Gatineau.

## **A meaningful day**

According to the liturgical calendar, November 30<sup>th</sup> is the feast of St. Andrew (one of The Most Reverend Durocher's given names is André). Not only was Andrew one of Christ's first disciples, he also introduced his brother Simon-Peter who would later become the first Pope. At the miraculous feeding of the crowd, it was Andrew who found the boy with the five loaves of bread and the two fish. When Greek men asked Philip to meet Jesus after the triumphant entry into Jerusalem, he transmitted the request to Andrew. After the Pentecost, Andrew is said to have travelled through to Turkey up to Ukraine (Kiev) and Russia (Novgorod) to spread the Good News.

We can think of Andrew as one who finds solutions and acts as an intermediary between people (his brother, the boy, the Greek men) and Christ, a function he kept all his life by preaching outside of Israel. What an excellent model for an Archbishop!
