

**THINGS ARE BACK TO “ORDINARY” IN THE CHURCH**

Thank you so much to those who took the Christmas decorations down at both churches. The **Christmas Season** is over, but it does not put an end to our living from what we celebrated in the Christmas Season: God’s gift of Jesus who in the power of the Spirit lives among us and is the enduring living source of our Christian identity.

Now we are into **Ordinary Time** as it is called in church language. It is very much as in life itself; we have our high and low points, and a lot of grey and ordinary areas in between. In all of it, Jesus Christ is the one who leads the way for us and in whom God graces us.

This year, Easter will be celebrated on April 8<sup>th</sup> so that **Ordinary Time** will be with us until Lent, with its purple, beginning on Ash Wednesday, February 22<sup>nd</sup>. It has been our practice in the last few years to rotate the Wednesday celebration with St. Aloysius in Gatineau; therefore, this year, we will celebrate Ash Wednesday on Tuesday, February 21<sup>st</sup>.

**CEMETERY PLOTS**

This past year, we have been very successful in helping the St. Grégoire cemetery committee locate families regarding their grave sites. The objective of this exercise is to update their records, so as to have the capacity to touch base with a family representative regarding their family plot. There are still numerous English family plots without updated information. In most cases, the graves are very old and families have either all passed away or their descendants have moved on. In our discussions with representatives from St. Grégoire, we agreed to review the list of outstanding contact persons in order to identify those who may still have relatives in this region and of whom parishioners might know their whereabouts.
