

### PARISHIONERS QUESTIONS ABOUT THE REVISED ROMAN MISSAL

In response to questions from parishioners on the new translation of the Roman Missal, it was decided to repeat the article previously published in the bulletin, as follows:

The Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops (CCCB) has received recognition for all sections of the English translation of the revised *Roman Missal* for use in Canada. The Permanent Council has agreed that the first Sunday of Advent, November 27, 2011, will be the date for the implementation of the English translation of the *Missal*.

Why is the Catholic Church implementing a revised English translation of the Order of Mass? The words are being revised for two basic reasons. One is that the contents of the book that we have been calling the Sacramentary have been expanded. Such books are always published first in Latin, and then need to be translated into vernacular languages. Now that there is a third edition, the Sacramentary is out of date. More significantly, the Vatican has changed its theory of translation. It used to allow a free rendering of the words inspired by the idioms of the vernacular language. Now the Vatican is asking for a translation that adheres more closely to the original.

All of the changes to the Roman Missal are included in the Pew Cards purchased from Novalis and available at the entrance to the church. You can also find the changes in the "Living with Christ" Sunday Missals.

#### **CEMETERY COMMITTEE**

On several occasions, parishioners have asked questions regarding the management changes that have been implemented by the Wardens at St. Grégoire with respect to the cemetery. There have been changes around costs, management of burial sites, monument upkeep etc. In order to better communicate to our parishioners actual policy changes and in order to avoid misinformation and rumours, the Wardens at St. Grégoire have offered our parish a seat on their Cemetery Management Committee. We have accepted this offer and Susan Lemieux has agreed to be our representative. More news will follow once Committee meets.

### **OLV UPDATE**

In several weeks, we will be presenting our 2011 Annual Financial Statement and all indications are that it will be quite reasonable. Even though many of our conversations are focussed on fund-raising, we want to take this opportunity to assure our parishioners that overall, our financial situation is solid and certainly we are in better shape than most parishes in the region.

However, we can't rest on our laurels. As wardens, we have made every effort to manage our finances prudently and are committed to continuing to take the necessary measures to improve our financial position. Controlling heating costs is a major challenge. Over the past few years, improvements have been made to the furnace to make it more cost efficient. We have also played an active role in organizing an Oil Committee with other churches and social organizations. The Committee has been very successful. Each year, this Committee holds a submission process to obtain the best oil prices possible. This year, we were able to negotiate a fixed price of \$1.05 per litre. Presently, the consumer price is \$1.18. This, you can well imagine, is resulting in a huge savings when you consider our two oil tanks have a capacity of 757 litres each.

This past year, we undertook mostly minor capital projects. We upgraded three, washrooms, replaced the door on our equipment shed and continued to make further minor investments in our furnace. This year, we will have to start to plan on replacing the wooden chairs we use for our special events. It is not a good sign when, before the last parish supper, someone had to go around and use duct tape to cover splinters and cracks in numerous chairs. We hope to start to replace the wooden chairs with plastic chairs .The plastic chairs are more durable and present a better longer-term investment. However, they are expensive, as the cost for one chair is close to \$15.00. We have 175 chairs that will eventually have to be replaced. So we are probably looking at a 3-4 year replacement plan. We will also need to replace several windows in the rectory and will eventually have to build a fence along our Joseph Street property to replace the cedar hedge that was there.

As stated on several other occasions, our collections are very good and your support is greatly appreciated. But the weekly collections do not meet our basic financial requirements or the costs of improvements. We are viable because of the additional contributions we receive from our special activities and rentals in the Rectory and Church basement.

This year, our fund-raising activities will be as follows: a Pancake breakfast on Saturday, February 4<sup>th</sup>, a Valentine's Dance scheduled for February 18<sup>th</sup>, St. Patrick's Tea in March, our Spring Supper and Balloon Auction on May 12<sup>th</sup>, Harvest Supper in October and our Christmas Tea and Concerts in December. All of the aforementioned activities will be affordable and are designed to bring our community together.

In closing, the Wardens would like to thank everyone for their support and wish all our parishioners a happy and safe New Year.
