


**FOOD FOR THE WEEK**

***“Des chemins qui marchent”***

To prepare for its 50th Anniversary in 2013, the Gatineau Diocese organized a trilogy of walking pilgrimages along the three major rivers of the diocese: the Petite Nation River in 2011; the Gatineau River in 2013; and the recently completed pilgrimage in the Lièvre.

Over 200 pilgrims took part in this pilgrimage which began on Sunday, May 27<sup>th</sup> with a mass at the Notre-Dame-des-Neiges church in Masson after which the pilgrims walked to Buckingham, stopping at Our Lady of Victory church for a lunch break.

Over the next few days, pilgrims were seen walking along the roads in the Lièvre Valley: along Donaldson Road walking to Perkins; to St-Pierre de Wakefield; to Poltimore, Val-des-Bois, Notre-Dame-de-la Salette, Lac Argile, Angers and from Champboisé to Mayo on Friday, June 1<sup>st</sup>.  
 Volunteers at both our parishes welcomed the pilgrims as they arrived, basically to rest while eating their

lunches, use the rest room, but also to visit our churches and the shrine in Mayo. Coffee, tea, water and refreshments were available in the church hall at OLV, although many participants preferred to sit on the front lawn while eating their lunches. And in Mayo, the pilgrims sat at the picnic tables which are usually set up for the August pilgrimage.

Participants of the pilgrimage continuously commented on the generosity of our parishes. The refreshments provided by our parishioners were a big hit, especially the gluten-free muffins! And every church visited along the journey received donations from the pilgrims.

The pilgrimage ended on Saturday, June 2<sup>nd</sup> with a mass in Angers, presided by Archbishop Paul-André Durocher, followed by a spaghetti supper in the Masson church hall provided by La mie de l'entraide, our local food bank.
