We Need Your Support

As many of you know, the English speaking churches, St. Andrews, St. Stephens, Our Lady of Victory and St. Malachy have been working together on several youth oriented projects. The *Camp ARK: Acts of Random Kindness* is a four-day ecumenical vacation Bible school offered free of charge to children and youth between the ages of three and fourteen who live in the Buckingham sector and its surrounding area. Now preparing to enter its fourth year, *Camp ARK* regularly attracts more than fifty young people for a week of Christian formation activities rooted in song, games, drama and visual arts.

The success of Camp ARK has led to the creation of two separate but associated groups for children and youth in the Buckingham community: the *Buckingham Ecumenical Sunday School* and the *Friday Night Faith Buddies*. The *Buckingham Ecumenical Sunday School* meets for one hour on a monthly basis and provides children between the ages of three and eleven with Christian formation activities similar to those offered at *Camp ARK*. The Sunday school currently attracts between fifteen and twenty-five children to its monthly meetings. Hosting duties are now shared between the community's Anglican, United and Roman Catholic congregations, with regular sessions scheduled to coincide with the congregations' Sunday worship times.

Launched in the fall of 2012, the activities of *The Friday Night Faith Buddies* are designed for youth between the ages of eight and fourteen. A self-directing group in which the young participants collectively determine their own activities, the *Faith Buddies* meet on the first Friday evening of every month at one of the community's Anglican, United or Roman Catholic congregations for two hours of fellowship, song and community service. The *Faith Buddies* average attendance is typically between twenty-five and thirty-five young people; activities to date have included a games night, a Christmas concert, and movie nights with proceeds benefiting local charities selected by the participants.

The rapid growth of Buckingham's ecumenical youth activities has led local lay leaders to establish *The Buckingham Ecumenical Table*, an ad-hoc forum that permits representatives of local English-speaking congregations to discuss joint-mission projects. In addition to supporting the various programs for church youth outlined above, the *Ecumenical Table* is currently exploring the creation of a collective kitchen in Buckingham to benefit seniors, shut-ins, and young families, and is also planning a number of other activities.

In order to fund these Ecumenical activities, the table is sponsoring a musical evening with Lyness and Judy Woodstock to be held at St. Stephens on **April 20th at**

7:00 PM. Advance Tickets are \$10.00 or \$15.00 at the door. Advance tickets will be on sale before and after mass until the event. **These worthwhile projects need your support** as our local churches actively partner to engage youth and their families in a Christian way of life.
