

REFLECTIONS ON READINGS, 12TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

When Bishop Paul Marchand, SMM, (of the Timmins Diocese) died suddenly a couple of years ago, he left behind notes showing what the diocesan priority would be for the new year: "Jesus is ... for me." Today's readings lead us to reflect on this very statement and contemplate anew who Jesus is in our lives.

Jesus' question to Peter – "Who do you say that I am?" – asks more than "What is my name?" Jesus beckons Peter to reflect on who he is to Peter. This calls for reflection on Peter's part and goes beyond pondering Jesus' reputation. The scriptures assign Jesus many titles and each one evokes a different facet of

the Son of God. At times in our lives, we may call upon Jesus as Shepherd, Healer, Brother or Counsellor to guide and sustain us.

In the second reading, Paul reinforces the grace of our baptism, affirming that through our baptism, we have put on Christ. This Christ whom we 'wear' identifies us – and who will people say that we are? Our new identity in baptism calls us to follow Christ with hearts open to the needs of others and to the many opportunities in our days to live in the salvation of God.

As we journey through our week, let us pause and reflect on Bishop Marchand's statement, "Jesus is ... for me" and on Jesus' question, "Who do you say that I am?"

SUNDAY CELEBRATION OF THE WORD

In April, parishioners received a copy of the Archbishop's letter regarding Sunday Celebration of the Word. Archbishop Durocher was urging each parish to identify at least two people who would be recognized as suitable to conduct Sunday Celebrations of the Word.

WORLD YOUTH DAY

Eleven young adults from our diocese are preparing themselves to attend **World Youth Day** in Rio de Janeiro.

The World Youth Day, held annually in the dioceses of the world, provides every 2 or 3 years an international meeting of young people with the Pope, which lasts about a week. The latest edition of the International Youth Day held in August 2011 in Madrid, Spain brought together more than 190 countries. The XXVIII World Youth Day will be held from July 23-28, 2013 in the city of Rio de Janeiro and has as its motto "Go and make disciples of all nations" (Mt 28, 19).

Three of the eleven young adults are from Buckingham and are parishioners at St. Luc's Parish. The three young individuals who plan to attend are 21, 20 and 16 years of age and are from same family. Incredibly, these young adults are from the Tremblay family of 14 children.

To help them in their fund-raising, local parishes have been asked to allow the groups' representatives to say a few words about this trip. Presentations have already been made at local churches (Masson, Angers, Buckingham, and

La Salette) and OLV has been asked to participate as well – we have scheduled this presentation for Sunday, July 7th. Following a short presentation made at the end of the celebration, they will be available at the church entrance with baskets and people can add something if they wish as they leave.

This is also the first Sunday of the month at OLV, with coffee and refreshments served in the church hall. The young adults will join this fellowship and be available to answer any questions.
