

NOVEMBER – THE MONTH IN WHICH WE REMEMBER THE DECEASED:

November is traditionally the month in which we give more attention to the remembrance of the deceased. Christians do so in a unique way based on what is central in our faith: the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ.

In our two parishes, we have a tradition of leaving our **Book of Life** at the front of the church for the month of November. The **Book of Life** contains the names of deceased parishioners and relatives. Some additional

pages are provided at the back of the book if anyone wants to add names. It is our way of expressing our faith that the dead find peace with God and will be raised to life when the Lord Jesus comes in glory. The families who lost someone in the past year were invited to participate in a short ceremony by lighting a candle from the Easter candle during our weekend celebrations.

The Book is placed next to the Easter Candle which speaks of the ultimate victory of life over death, of light over darkness, in the dead and risen Jesus. We are called to share in that victory.

CELEBRATING TODAY'S LITURGY:

The celebration of Eucharist offers us an opportunity to bring together the various strands present in today's liturgy of the word. First, we assemble to celebrate in Eucharist the wonders of God's creation and to experience Christ's presence.

Second, the action of assembling implies that we celebrate together, as a community, with all of our insecurities and differences, our strengths and our weaknesses.

Since receiving the body of Christ is a communal event, may we be especially attentive to the needs of others during this liturgical moment, allowing others to go before us, being patient with those who walk more slowly, and opening our hearts in prayer on behalf of all of God's creation.
