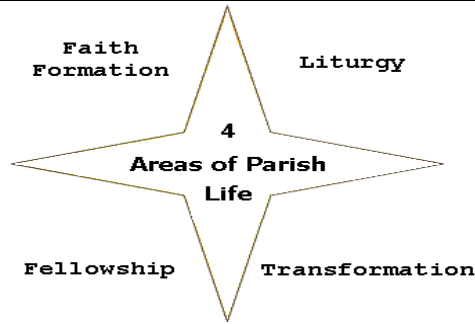

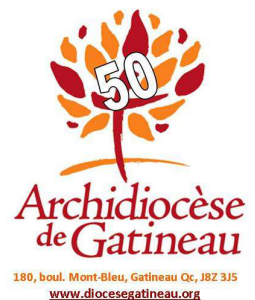

THE PERMANENT DIACONAT – A PASTORAL LETTER:

In October, Archbishop Paul-André Durocher published a Pastoral Letter on [the Permanent Diaconate of the Archdiocese of Gatineau](#). Enclosed with the bulletin is a copy of the Pastoral Letter which announces the ordination of two new permanent deacons to the service of our diocese and provides some background information on permanent deacons.

In closing, the Pastoral Letter indicates that the diaconate is a gift to the Church of Gatineau and ends with the following "Let us therefore rejoice in the ordination of these two new deacons. We pray for all those who, in our diocese or elsewhere, are discerning this call in their lives or are in the formation program".

NOVEMBER – THE MONTH IN WHICH WE REMEMBER THE DECEASED:

November is traditionally the month in which we give more attention to the remembrance of the deceased. Christians do so in a unique way based on what is central in our faith: the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. In our two parishes, we have a tradition of leaving our **Book of Life** at the front of the church for the month of November. The **Book of Life** contains the names of deceased parishioners and relatives. Some additional pages are provided at the back of the book if anyone wants to add names. It is our way of expressing our faith that the dead find peace with God and will be raised to life when the Lord Jesus comes in glory.

The Book is placed next to the Easter Candle which speaks of the ultimate victory of life over death, of light over darkness, in the dead and risen Jesus. We are called to share in that victory.

ST. MALACHY- ELECTION OF WARDENS:

Each year two church wardens are to be elected for a three year term and can remain in office for two consecutive terms.

This year Leila Corrigan will be completing one term and has agreed to let her name stand for renomination. Gladys Miller will be completing her second term. Special collection for the victims of typhoon in Philippines: November 30th and December 1st 2013

Development and Peace and the Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops (CCCB) have launched a joint appeal for relief efforts in response to Typhoon Haiyan, which swept away villages and destroyed many communities in the Philippines last Friday.

“We are presently supporting the distribution of necessities, the basics that people need to survive. There is no doubt, however, that in the face of such a calamity, we will need to provide long-term support to communities in their efforts to rebuild, which is really our strength,” said Michael Casey, Executive Director of **Development and Peace**.

In a letter addressed to the Bishops of Canada, the Most Reverend Paul-André Durocher, Archbishop of Gatineau and President of the CCCB, asked that a special national collection take place before December 9th, the deadline for donations to be matched by the Government of Canada.

“We are grateful for the support of the CCCB in this appeal and the generosity of Canadian Catholics across the country towards their brothers and sisters in the Philippines,” he added. Donations made to **Development and Peace** for relief efforts are eligible for the matching fund program announced by the Canadian government.
