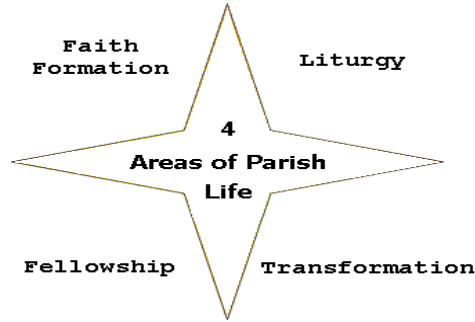

50TH ANNIVERSARY – DIOCESE OF GATINEAU

Over the past year, we have been celebrating the 50th anniversary of our Diocese. Through reflection, the Diocese has been compared to a family whose bond is one of connection and partnership. This family, our Diocese, is about people – hundreds, thousands – who have rooted themselves in the love of God and community and who, through shared values, have built our parish and our Diocese.

As we come to the end of our anniversary and with a focus on the future, the Archbishop has suggested that we continue our pilgrimage of faith through a special Prayer of the Faithful followed by a personal pledge to commit ourselves to continue our growth as a faith community. Parishioners will receive a bookmark with the Covenant Pledge to be recited at the Christ the King celebrations this weekend.

NOVEMBER – THE MONTH IN WHICH WE REMEMBER THE DECEASED:

November is traditionally the month in which we give more attention to the remembrance of the deceased. Christians do so in a unique way based on what is central in our faith: the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. In our two parishes, we have a tradition of leaving our **book of life** at the front of the church for the month of November. The *Book of Life* contains the names of deceased parishioners and relatives. Some additional pages are provided at the back of the book if anyone wants to add names. It is our way of expressing our faith that the dead find peace with God and will be raised to life when the Lord Jesus comes in glory.

The Book is placed next to the Easter Candle which speaks of the ultimate victory of life over death, of light over darkness, in the dead and risen Jesus. We are called to share in that victory.

As we have done for many years, our two parishes will participate in the Lions Club Telethon. SPECIAL COLLECTION FOR THE VICTIMS OF TYPHOON IN PHILIPPINES:

November 30th and December 1st 2013

Development and Peace and the Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops (CCCB) have launched a joint appeal for relief efforts in response to Typhoon Haiyan, which swept away villages and destroyed many communities in the Philippines last Friday.

“We are presently supporting the distribution of necessities, the basics that people need to survive. There is no doubt, however, that in the face of such a calamity, we will need to provide long-term support to communities in their efforts to rebuild, which is really our strength,” said Michael Casey, Executive Director of **Development and Peace**.

In a letter addressed to the Bishops of Canada, the Most Reverend Paul-André Durocher, Archbishop of Gatineau and President of the CCCB, asked that a special national collection take place before December 9th, the deadline for donations to be matched by the Government of Canada.

“We are grateful for the support of the CCCB in this appeal and the generosity of Canadian Catholics across the country towards their brothers and sisters in the Philippines,” he added. Donations made to **Development and Peace** for relief efforts are eligible for the matching fund program announced by the Canadian government.
