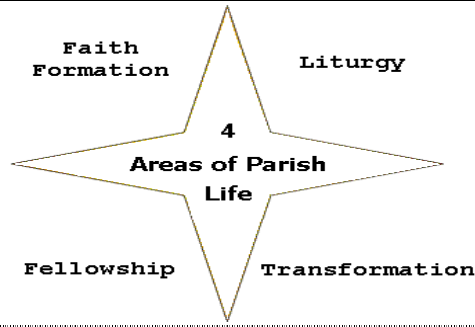

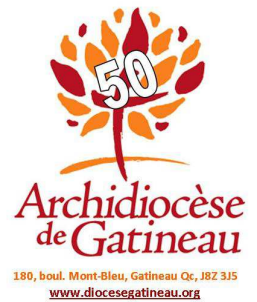

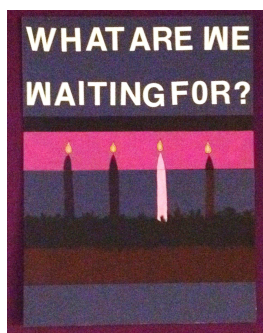
Reading I Isaiah 11.1 - 10

Isn't it extraordinary how a mortified, man draws people. We admire one whose needs are minimal, who is the master of his own appetites, who has a deep interior freedom. John the Baptist, with minimal clothes and minimal food, was a magnet. People trusted him because clearly he could not be bought.

Where are the chains on me, the appetites that I have not mastered, and that pull me in ways I do not want? Help me towards a freer heart and body, Lord.

As we approach the wonderful feast of Christmas, the peace that is part of our Christmas prayer often seems only a dream. Even in today's Gospel, John the Baptist, announcing the coming Messiah, speaks of destructive fire and the wrath that is to come. John is trying to prepare his listeners for the one who is coming, and reminds the crowd that we are known by our lives and actions. He calls on his listeners to look at their lives and repent, to make the changes needed to welcome the Christ.

The kind of life John encourages his audience to live is seen in the first reading, which sounds a more positive note. Isaiah looks to a time when there will be peace, when all creatures will live in harmony and what we call paradise will reign. How this will come about is not clear, but Isaiah tells us it will happen when truth prevails and integrity rules. This places the responsibility for peace at the feet of each one of us. Isaiah calls us to live in truth and integrity, to be true children of God, people who make God visible to others.

This is the **Advent** preparation that will bring the peace of Christ to the world. It is living our baptismal faith, recognizing that each of us is responsible for building community, for bringing God to birth in our world.

Today's Gospel shows John the Baptist clashing with the Jewish religious authorities. John's message was about justice, about social change. He challenged the people of Israel to get down to the root causes of problems, to uproot unfruitful trees.

In the fall of 2011, after consultation with partners in the Global South, **Development and Peace** launched a 5-year program to promote integral human development consistent with ecological justice. The partners of **Development and Peace** want Canadians to know that the precious minerals and metals found in their countries are being extracted and imported with the promise that the required investment will bring development to their region. However, the revenues from mining are not leading to long-term development for communities, and in many instances, communities are also facing gross injustices.

The action we are taking together this year is to renew the call for an effective ombudsman in Canada that would have the power to investigate complaints, make its findings public and make recommendations to remedy any violations. Recent newspaper clippings on this subject can be found on the board with the **Development and Peace** posters. The insert with this week's bulletin describes injustices faced by some communities as well as the **Development and Peace** action we are being asked to take. Action cards and a petition will be available next week.
