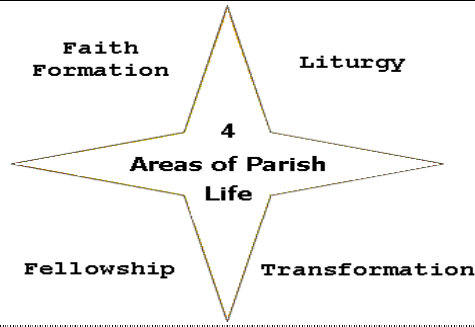

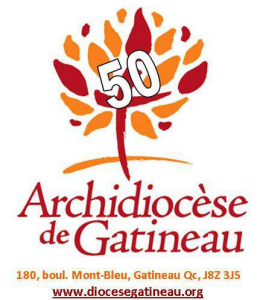

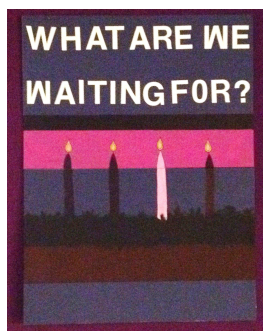

Today, we light a rose-coloured candle in the Advent wreath, a mark of Gaudete (“rejoice”) Sunday. As we have now passed the mid-point of this penitential season, we breathe a little easier and our anticipation rises as we await the coming of our Lord at Christmas.

And who is this One we await? Remember the bumper sticker, “Jesus is the reason for the season”? Banal and vaguely irritating, perhaps, yet on the mark nonetheless. On this particular Sunday, the insistent cheerfulness of the rose candle reinforces the message: He is coming!

In the lives we lead at work or home, we begin to feel a certain intensity to this season. The grind lessens, the daily tasks seem somewhat beside the point. Almost unconsciously, people are kinder to one another. The mood lightens noticeably. We feel that Christmas is just around the corner. At the same time, our seasonal anxiety gets more intense. For many, the season holds only grim reminders of what they do not have, of relationships soured, of old grievances that have eluded resolution.

We are no more immune to the trials and tribulations of the human condition than anyone else. There is nothing about our beliefs that guarantees we will be wiser or better behaved than anyone else. But what we have is a belief in a God who cares so much for us that he gave us his only Son.

“O come, O come Emmanuel,” we sing in Advent – and this week with just a little more gusto.

In today’s Gospel, we hear that people came to John the Baptist, and his message was a simple one that seems to transcend time and place. It hits us with as powerful an impact as it did the people of his time. The soldiers came and they said, “What should we do?” and he said, “Don’t exploit the people, don’t push them around, don’t manipulate.”

The Baptist is concerned about justice. In Advent we wait. We wait for the Child to be born, and the Child is a Child of justice.

The **Development and Peace** campaign - **A Voice for Justice** - calls on the Government of Canada to establish an independent ombudsman for the Canadian extractive sector that can investigate complaints brought by communities overseas where companies operate. Literature on the campaign has been distributed to parishioners for the past two weeks. This weekend, Action Cards and a Petition will be distributed and parishioners are encouraged to sign both the Action Card and the Petition in order that **Development and Peace** can present the cards to the respective MPs in Ottawa.

Extra copies of the Action Cards and the Petition will be left at the entrance until after Christmas.
