# A LENTEN VOYAGE

The season of Lent gives us an opportunity to reflect on how we handle challenges in times of trial. We, like Jesus, find times in our lives spent in our own deserts that leave us worn down and looking for a way out. With the temptations of an increasing secular world, will we have the strength to make the proper choices when our relationships with friends, families, co-workers or more importantly with God are tested? Will we have the strength and resolve to make proper choices that reflect our long-term interests rather than immediate solutions that seem to make a problem go away?

How will we mark our 40-day trek to Easter? The traditional Lenten practices of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving are aiming to get us in shape for Easter.

Prayer: Our Sunday liturgies, with their rich Bible readings, provide the basic orientation for Lent.

**Fasting**: We diet: we cut down on food and drink for a variety of reasons. During Lent we could refrain from some food, a drink, a party, a video or movie as a gesture of solidarity with so many of those in our world who have no choice in these matters for the simple reason that they do not have them.

**Almsgiving**: This flows naturally from the previous two practices. Almsgiving says we care for others even to the point of depriving ourselves from something. How about if we put the money that we save by some form of fasting aside and make it into our contribution to the special Development and Peace Lenten collection that will be held later in Lent?



Food sovereignty is the right of people to healthy food and the right to define their own food and agricultural systems. *Development and Peace* is supporting several local organizations in the Global South who are promoting food sovereignty as a way to help communities affected by poverty and hunger have access to land, seeds and fair prices at the market so they can feed their families. In Haiti, these projects are making a difference in the lives of many. Women are learning to plant fruit tree nurseries. They can use the fruit not only as nourishment but also to earn an income.
