

Thomas was a modern man, finding faith hard. He was let down by the others who ran away, the leader who denied Jesus; his trust had been abused. He did not want much more to do with this. He wanted to believe but needed some proof.

But faith grows within a community. We find growth in our faith through the community in the Mass, sharing our faith in a group, a good spiritual book, sharing our doubts but never closing the door to Jesus, sharing our faith in thanks.

## **Second Sunday of Easter**

The Gospels tell us that Jesus appeared to the disciples on several occasions after they discovered that his tomb was empty. Part of the mystery of Jesus' Resurrection is that he appeared to his disciples, not as a spirit, but in bodily form. The bodily form was not one that the disciples recognized though. In John's Gospel, Mary of Magdala does not recognize that the figure standing before her is Jesus until he speaks to her. In Luke's Gospel, the disciples who meet Jesus on the road to Emmaus do not recognize him until he breaks bread with them. The resurrected Jesus had a physical presence, but the disciples couldn't recognize Jesus unless he allowed them to. His resurrected body, nonetheless, showed the marks of his crucifixion.

From readings such as this Sunday's Gospel, we also see that in his resurrected body, Jesus seems to be free of physical constraints. He appears to the disciples despite the fact that the doors were locked.

Jesus greets his disciples with the gift of peace and the gift of the Holy Spirit. In doing so, Jesus commissions his disciples to continue the work that he has begun: "As the Father has sent me, so I send you." During the meeting, Jesus also shows the integral connection between forgiveness of sins and the gift of the Holy Spirit.

The story of Thomas illustrates our Christian experience today: We are called to believe without seeing. In fact, all Christians after the first witnesses have been called to believe without seeing. Thomas' doubt is hardly surprising; the news of Jesus' appearance was incredible to the disciples who had seen him crucified and buried. Thomas' human nature compelled him to want hard evidence that the Jesus who appeared to the disciples after his death was indeed the same Jesus who had been crucified. Thomas is given the opportunity to act on that desire. He is our witness that Jesus is really risen.

Our faith is based on the witness of the Church that has preceded us, beginning with Thomas and the first disciples. Through Baptism, we receive the same Holy Spirit that Jesus brought to the first disciples. We are among those who are "blessed" because we believe without having seen.

# Why are there 50 days of Easter?

Easter is not just "Easter Day", it is the 50 days from Easter Day until the Day of Pentecost. During this season, Sundays are named "xxx Sunday of Easter" rather than "xxx Sunday after Easter". For example, "The Fourth Sunday of Easter", is the official name rather than trying to say "The Third Sunday after Easter".

Easter, Ascension and Pentecost do not form three seasons. The Easter Season celebrates the three dimensions of the resurrection, ascension and the sending of the Spirit.

These 50 days, one-seventh of the year, form our great "Sunday" of the year. "Alleluia! Christ is risen". He is risen indeed. "Alleluia" forms the greeting in every service during Eastertide. Similarly "Alleluia! Alleluia!" is added to the dismissal and the people's response to help to give these celebrations a distinctive festal feel.

This is also why the Pascal Candle is lit at every service up to an including the Day of Pentecost and why we sing "Glory to God in the Highest" from Easter Day through the Day of Pentecost.
