

LABOUR DAY

Monday, September 1st is Labour Day, another important national holiday.

The dignity of labour has been brought out more than once in church teaching, even being afforded an encyclical on the subject (Pope John Paul II's *Laborem Exercens*, On Human Work, issued September 15, 1981). Christian labour really embraces more than an honest day's work and just compensation. Human labour parallels the work of God in creation and redemption, and so our own work is a participation in God's self-giving for the good of others.

Moreover, human labour is also more than making a living, as important as that is. Human labour also includes building up the church and making present God's kingdom in our world. Even the "work" of liturgy ("liturgy" comes from two Greek words meaning "the work of the people") is something to be celebrated this day!
