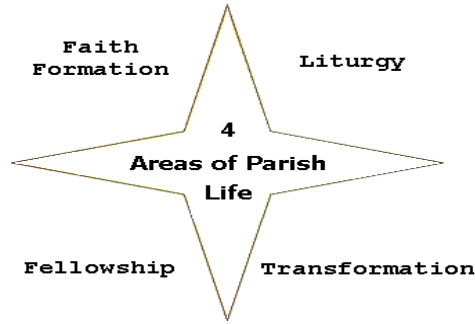

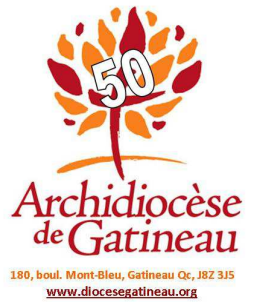

OCTOBER 2014 – “FOR PEACE IN THE WORLD”**

Pray that the Lord will grant peace to the regions of the world most affected by war, terrorism and violence.

Social Reflection:

Each of us has to build a better world, a world of peace, understanding and tolerance. We must not say it's not our fault, it does not concern us, we can't do anything. We can all do something to build peace. When we were kids, our parents told us "little streams make big rivers..." One helps another, that one yet another, and so on: we can and must live in

Our Faith Response:

The Christian faith calls us to live at peace with ourselves, others and God. The prophet Isaiah in his book announced the coming of the Messiah as the "Prince of Peace" (Isaiah 9.5). The peace that Jesus came to bring us is not simply human peace, but real, deep peace. In the Gospel of John, Jesus says, "I leave you peace, my peace I give you. I do not give it to you as the world gives it" (John 14, 27). The peace proclaimed by Jesus is the peace that transforms both individuals and society. In the Catholic tradition, peace is associated with the expressions justice, development and the common good. What can we do in our daily living to contribute to such peace?

Resolution for Week:

Sunday, October 19, 2014 – Paul VI said that development contributes to peace. With Mission Sunday, I contribute to the missionary collection to help countries and their local churches develop, and so live in peace.

OLV News

A Generous Donation:

The Wardens, on behalf of our Parishioners, would like to recognize Bill Lawlis (Estate) for the generous donation of \$6,000. It was Bill's wish that \$3,000 be directed towards the Parish's operating costs and \$3,000 towards the management and maintenance of the O'Neil Cemetery located on Church Street. It is with gratitude that we accept this wonderful gift.

Follow-up to Budget Information Session:

A number of Parishioners made several recommendations to address our budget challenges. The following are what we are presently focusing on:

- Input From Parishioners - It was suggested that Parishioners who have ideas on possible fund-raising activities or how we can reduce expenses place their ideas in the collection basket. The deadline for input is November 9th.
- Move to Natural Gas - A meeting will be held with an expert to discuss the economics of moving from oil to gas. Once the cost benefit analysis, both pro and con, has been developed, consultations will be held with Parishioners before a final decision is made.
- Insulation of the Ceiling - Consultations have been scheduled with a contractor to get an estimate of how much it would cost to insulate the church ceiling. Again a decision will not be made without consultation with Parishioners. The cost benefit analysis on gas/oil will play a strong role in any final decision on insulating the roof.
- Meeting With Diocesan Officials - As was highlighted in last week's bulletin, a representative of the Diocese has agreed to meet with the Wardens to discuss the Diocesan tax and other issues raised by parishioners. Further details to follow.
