

MONTHLY PRAYER INTENTIONS FROM THE BISHOP OCTOBER 2014 – "FOR PEACE IN THE WORLD"

Pray that the Lord will grant peace to the regions of the world most affected by war, terrorism and violence.

Social Reflection:

Each of us has to build a better world, a world of peace, understanding and tolerance. We must not say it's not our fault, it does not concern us, we can't do anything. We can all do something to build peace. When we were kids, our parents told us "little streams make big rivers..." One helps another, that one yet another, and so on: we can and must live in solidarity and become builders of WORLD PEACE....

Our Faith Response:

The Christian faith calls us to live at peace with ourselves, others and God. The prophet Isaiah in his book announced the coming of the Messiah as the "Prince of Peace" (Isaiah 9.5). The peace that Jesus came to bring us is not simply human peace, but real, deep peace. In the Gospel of John, Jesus says, "I leave you peace, my peace I give you. I do not give it to you as the world gives it" (John 14, 27). The peace proclaimed by Jesus is the peace that transforms both individuals and society. In the Catholic tradition, peace is associated with the expressions justice, development and the common good. What can we do in our daily living to contribute to such peace?

Resolution for Week:

Sunday, October 26, 2014 – All change begins with a personal, inner conversion. I try to identify the attitudes that will make me an instrument of peace.

THIRTIETH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME – YEAR A – OCTOBER 26, 2014 PRAYER OF THE FAITHFUL

For the Church: that we may be stirred to desire deeper union with God and genuine concern for others. We pray to the Lord.

For government leaders: that God will guide them in confronting the evils and challenges of our day, especially those faced by the weak, powerless and vulnerable. We pray to the Lord.

For the growth of peace, particularly in the Mid-East: that God will touch the hearts of leaders, and help them find new ways to resolve disputes non-violently. We pray to the Lord.

For the Canadian people: that through the Spirit of God, their hearts will be touched by love and forgiveness in light of the attacks on the members of the military. We pray to the Lord.

For each one of us: that we may be peacemakers in our families, at work and at play. We pray to the Lord.

For all who are ill: that God's healing love may renew and strengthen them; for the deceased of our community and all the dead and all who mourn them; for Jean-Paul Robitaille whom we call by name at this celebration. We pray to the Lord.

ALL SAINTS' DAY - November 1st

Next Saturday is the feast of All Saints. This feast honours all the saints of the Church, known and unknown. The occasion provides an opportunity to reflect on the nature of sainthood and to celebrate the exemplary faithfulness of holy men and women of every place and time whose lives and deeds continue to inspire us.

Originally a feast in the Eastern Church for all martyrs, it was extended to the whole Roman Church in the 9th century as a feast including non-martyrs. It was given this date, November 1, to counter a pagan feast on the same day. In England it was called Allhallows. ('Hallow' is from the Old English word for 'holy'). Thus 'Hallowe'en, a vestige of this pagan celebration, is from 'Allhallows even,' or 'the eve of All Saints'.

ALL SOULS' DAY – November 2nd

The month of November is a special month for praying for the faithful departed with whom we are in the same Communion of the Saints. We are therefore encouraged to keep them in our prayers and if possible offer Masses on their behalf.

In our parishes, we have a tradition of leaving our Book of Life at the front of the church for the month of November.
