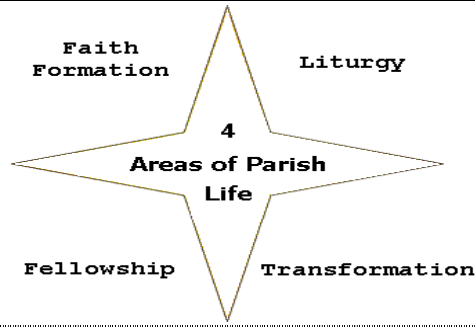

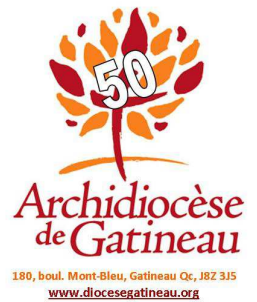

EUCCHARISTIC MINISTERS WORKSHOP

Maintaining the health of our faith communities, both parishes, takes both financial and liturgical participation on the part of all parishioners. Recently, particularly at OLV, the focus has been on the financial well-being of our community and less so on Liturgy and its supporting ministries.

There is now a need to refocus our efforts on the health of our ministries. The Inter-Parish Planning Committee and Father Albanus have been developing workshops for the various ministries. In the immediate term, the focus will be on Eucharistic Ministers and then with other ministries such as Servers and Lectors.

A workshop for Eucharistic Ministers from both parishes will be held at OLV (in the Church) on Tuesday, January 27th at 7:00 pm. The challenge we are now facing is that we need more parishioners to step forward and commit to participating in a Ministry. We are inviting not only existing ministers' participation in this workshop, but also those who are not ministers. We are not asking parishioners to commit by attending this workshop, but simply to participate and find out more about the ministry and then make a decision. No pressure will be exerted on those attending.

WE ARE BACK IN ORDINARY TIME

Today we begin a continuous reading of Mark's Gospel that will carry us through this segment of the Liturgical Season or Ordinary Time. Mark's Gospel is told with a great sense of urgency and immediacy. Jesus is a person of action, and events occur in rapid succession. We see this in today's Gospel, time is of the essence; the fishermen immediately put aside their livelihood to become Jesus' disciples. The Kingdom of God is here and now. The time of fulfillment is at hand. How might our lives be different if we more fully shared this sense of immediacy of God's kingdom?

MONTHLY PRAYER INTENTIONS FROM THE ARCHBISHOP JANUARY, 2015 – "THE PROMOTION OF PEACE"

For all those who come from different religious traditions and for those government organizations responsible for promoting peace; that they collaborate in the promotion of peace, especially in their decision-making.

Social Reflection:

Quebec and Canada are known as calm, peaceful and welcoming places where life is good. Many people have dreamed of settling here. However, for the last decade, Canada's image on the international stage has faded and our policies have become tougher. The events of the last months show us that we are not immune to the rise of violence in our country. How as citizens can we, in this context, work to promote peace?

Answer for Our Faith:

We have just celebrated the feast of Christmas which reminds us of the birth of our Savior. For us, Jesus Christ is "the Prince of Peace" (Is 9.5). In Luke's Gospel after his baptism, Jesus quotes Isaiah by saying that he will come to release those who are marginalized and bring peace to their hearts. "The Beatitudes" in Matthew announce happiness by attitudes of peace. Following Jesus, Christianity promotes values of peace, justice and freedom. How as Christian communities can we be carriers of the peace of Christ?

Reflection for This Week:

I reflect on how my encounter with Christ released me and gave me inner peace. I take time to read the letter to Philemon, which denounces slavery and introduces what is freedom in Christ.
