

WELCOMING - A JOURNEY TOWARDS EASTER

We started our Lenten voyage on Ash Wednesday. As noted in previous bulletins, *Free the Gift, Share the Word* has been chosen as the theme for the Diocesan Pastoral Priorities for 2014-2017. For year one, the focus is on welcoming. The Archbishop has suggested that we celebrate this Lenten season under a common banner - "*Welcoming, A Journey towards Easter.*" Part of this journey includes the singing of the theme composed by the Archbishop, *Teach us, Loving God*. Copies of the hymn can be found at the entrance.

The Gospel readings for the five Sundays of Lent this year really lend themselves well to an ongoing reflection on the role of welcoming in a Christian life. Each Sunday there will be a paragraph in the bulletin reflecting on the readings to assist parishioners with their special Lenten prayer intentions.

2^{ndt} Sunday: Welcoming, A Way of Discovery

Jesus is transfigured before three of his apostles, and they discover the deep reality of this man with whom they have journeyed for three years. Each person is a mystery, even unto themselves. The act of welcoming involves discovering a bit of this mystery... and allowing another to discover something of my own mystery. Beyond simple, everyday appearances, each person carries a treasure in their hearts. Welcoming another allows us to discover this treasure.



DEVELOPMENT AND PEACE - Sowing seeds of justice for women and girls in Nigeria

Doubly poor are those women who endure situations of exclusion, mistreatment, and violence, since they are frequently less able to defend their rights. Even so, we constantly witness among them impressive examples of daily heroism in defending and protecting their vulnerable families. Pope Francis, The Joy of the Gospel, 212.

Supporting women and girls is a priority for DEVELOPMENT AND PEACE. When 276 girls were kidnapped by Boko Haram from Chibok in Nigeria, our local Nigerian partner began working for their freedom, and has managed to smuggle three girls to safety. "The three girls, who were 17, 18, and 19 years old, still seemed to be under the effect of the swirl of emotions generated by the trials they experienced since their abduction," states Raphael Yimga Tatchi, DEVELOPMENT AND PEACE program officer for Nigeria. "Their voices and lost eyes betray deep pain... glimmers of humanity shine through only when they courageously recount the details of their escape."

Gas Conversion Project

The Diocese has approved the Parish's plan to convert its oil-based heating system to a gas-based system. The successful bid was submitted by Alpha Combustible. The total value of the bid is \$24,580 plus tax, with work expected to commence in mid-June. The cost of heading resulting from this conversion is expected to be \$11,000 per year. Last year our oil bill was \$28,000. Based on the proposed savings from gas, our investment will be recovered within a year and a half. As construction commences, we will keep parishioners updated on progress.

The contract with Alpha Combustible was signed on February 25th.
