

Financial Report Highlights (2014)

As reported last week, the Parish reported a surplus of \$12,278 for 2014. This was a vast improvement over 2013 where the deficit was \$14,307.

Revenues increased by approximately \$20,000. Two primary reasons for this impressive turnaround were: the Parish initiated a fund-raising campaign that targeted both parishioners and non-church goers who had a link to the Parish whether through their own past experiences or through those of their parents and grandparents. This strategy, which we termed "Beyond the Walls," exceeded all expectations and resulted in donations totaling \$11,500. Another area which saw an increase was through legacy donations and special donations from parishioners and outside sources such as the Knights of Columbus. These donations contributed \$9,000 to the revenue base.

With respect to expenses, expenditures were reduced by \$6,000. Salary costs were reduced by \$3,000, (aided by the Diocese who paid Father Gyan's salary for a short period of time); office supply budget reduced by \$1,600; and through constant monitoring, oil costs reduced by \$2,134. While these amounts seem small, they all add up to overall savings in the long run. Every dollar saved is important.

The Wardens take this opportunity to thank our parishioners who continue to provide generous support both on a weekly basis and by faithfully supporting our fund-raising activities. Also, thank you to our contract employees who accepted a salary freeze and in some cases reduced hours. And finally, thank you to all those who, while they do not attend Mass, believe that the survival of our Parish is of great importance.

We need your help!

As witnessed in this bulletin, we have spent a lot of time and effort focussing on the business side of managing the Parish. Of equal importance, or perhaps of even greater importance, is the spiritual support for our community. **There is a need for more Eucharistic ministers, servers and ushers**. It is essential that these three ministries find greater support within the Parish. At this time, we continue to rely on a few volunteers to provide the support we all take for granted. The Canadian Catholic Organization for **Development and Peace** (CCODP) has been in constant communication with the General Secretariat of *Caritas Internationalis* since the terrible earthquake hit Nepal during the night of Friday, April 24th. The Canadian Council of Canadian Bishops (CCCB) has announced this week that it will participate with **Development and Peace** in a joint campaign to raise funds for the victims of the earthquake. In addition, the Government of Canada has also announced it will match any contributions to assist Nepal which are collected by this coming May 25th.

Our Lady of Victory and St. Malachy parishes will be collecting all donations from parishioners next weekend (May 9 & 10) as well as the following weekend (May 16 & 17).
