

MONTHLY PRAYER INTENTIONS FROM THE ARCHBISHOP - MAY

“That through the intercession of Mary, Christians living in secularized communities may become available to proclaim Jesus.”

Reflection on Social Issues: The western world has known a long period of Christian society. Since the cultural revolution of the 1960's, the faith no longer holds pride of place in western society. It is sometimes difficult for us to present ourselves as believers and announce the important place Jesus Christ has in our lives. How can we learn to live as Christians in Quebec society today? How are we prepared to make a defense to anyone who asks [us] for a reason for the hope that is in [us]? (1 P 3, 15)

Our Faith Response: In the first centuries, the Church lived her life marginalized within society. For the first generation of believers, as for us today, the Faith is a source of comfort. The Gospel of Luke invites us to “read the signs of the times” which exhorts us to love and to understand the world we are a part of. Jesus watches over the faithful, protecting and strengthening us daily. In His priestly prayer in John's Gospel, Jesus sends us out into the world (John 17:18) as sheep among wolves. His intent is for us to be His witnesses. Like Mary, Star of the Gospel, how can I live within this secularized society and witness to my faith with confidence?

Question We Need to Ask Ourselves

Sunday 17 May 2015: How can I bear fruit and affirm my hope in Jesus Christ by ministering to the marginalized of society?

Trip to Medjugorje

On June 24th 1981, six children from a small rural village called Medjugorje located in Bosnia–Herzegovina made the astonishing claim that they had seen an apparition of the Blessed Virgin Mary on the side of a hill at approximately six o'clock in the evening. The children claimed that they saw an incredibly beautiful young woman with a little child in her arms. They said that she didn't say anything to them, but indicated with gestures that they should come closer. Surprised and frightened, they were afraid to come near, even though they immediately thought her to be Our Lady.

Over the years the Blessed Virgin has reportedly provided the visionaries with 10 secrets which contain information on future events. Of the 10 secrets, only one, the third has been revealed. It involves a visible and permanent sign that is described as beautiful and indestructible and not of this world which will be left on the apparition hill, the site of the first appearance. It should be noted that apparitions continue to this date.

Medjugorje has become one of the most popular pilgrimage sites for Catholics in the world. It is estimated that 40 million pilgrims of all faiths have come to Medjugorje since 1981.

If anyone is interested, a Pilgrimage is being organized to visit Medjugorje which is being led by Father Gérard Marier. The dates being proposed for the trip to Bosnia–Herzegovina is September 29th to October 9th 2015. More information can be obtained by calling 1-877-271-1230, extension 27, and ask for Mélanie.
