PENTECOST SUNDAY

The season of Easter concludes with today's celebration, the feast of Pentecost. On Pentecost we celebrate the descent of the Holy Spirit upon the apostles gathered in the upper room in Jerusalem; this event marks the beginning of the Church.

In the context of the feast of Pentecost, the Gospel from John 20:19-23 reminds us about the integral connection between the gifts of peace and forgiveness and the action of the Holy Spirit. Jesus greets his disciples with the gift of peace. Jesus then commissions his disciples to continue the work that he has begun: "As the Father has sent me, so I send you." He breathes the Holy Spirit upon the disciples and sends them to continue his work of reconciliation through the forgiveness of sins. Jesus' act of breathing the Holy Spirit upon the apostles mirrors God's act of breathing life into Adam. In fact, both the Greek and Hebrew words for "spirit" can also be translated as "breath."

This Gospel reminds us that the Church is called to be a reconciling presence in the world. The reconciling presence of Christ is celebrated in the Church's sacramental life. In the Sacrament of Baptism, we are cleansed of sin and become a new creation in Christ. In the Sacrament of Penance, the Church celebrates the mercy of God through the forgiveness of sins. This reconciling presence is also to be a way of life for Christians. *In situations of conflict, we are to be agents of peace and harmony among people.*

MONTHLY PRAYER INTENTIONS FROM THE ARCHBISHOP - MAY

"That through the intercession of Mary, Christians living in secularized communities may become available to proclaim Jesus."

Reflection on Social Issues: The western world has known a long period of Christian society. Since the cultural revolution of the 1960's, the faith no longer holds pride of place in western society. It is sometimes difficult for us to present ourselves as believers and announce the important place Jesus Christ has in our lives. How can we learn to live as Christians in Quebec society today? How are we prepared to make a defense to anyone who asks [us] for a reason for the hope that is in [us]? (1 P 3, 15)

Our Faith Response: In the first centuries, the Church lived her life marginalized within society. For the first generation of believers, as for us today, the Faith is a source of comfort. The Gospel of Luke invites us to "read the signs of the times" which exhorts us to love and to understand the world we are a part of. Jesus watches over the faithful, protecting and strengthening us daily. In His priestly prayer in John's Gospel, Jesus sends us out into the world (John 17:18) as sheep among wolves. His intent is for us to be His witnesses. Like Mary, Star of the Gospel, how can I live within this secularized society and witness to my faith with confidence? **Sunday 24 May 2015**: On this Pentecost Sunday, I pray that the Holy Spirit strengthens me in my social obligations and in my life of faith.
