

THE JUBILEE YEAR OF MERCY

During the mass celebration on Saturday, December 12th at 7:00 p.m. Archbishop Durocher will bless the door that has been designated as the Holy Door for the year. Pope Francis has asked that a door be identified in each cathedral of the world to serve as a symbol of mercy for the whole year and that it be inaugurated on the third Sunday of Advent.

All the faithful of the diocese are invited to this celebration to launch this year of mercy as expressed by our Holy Father. It will certainly be a time of renewal and commitment for our Diocesan Church.

BISHOP'S MONTHLY INTENTIONS – DECEMBER 2015

“That we may all experience God’s mercy - He who never grows weary of offering forgiveness.”

Social reflection: The year 2015 has been eventful internationally. In January and November, Paris was the target of terrorist attacks. Many countries are going through repression, either internally or from external forces. Right now, Syria is going through the worst emigration crisis on earth since the end of WW II. Has society lost its humanity? Can we still hope of one day living in a society where people love each other?

Answering our faith: Advent marks the beginning of a new liturgical year. Pope Francis has decreed this upcoming year as the Year of Mercy, recognized by all religious faiths: Muslims, Jews and Christians. We as Catholics believe in a merciful God who always forgives and who asks us to do the same towards our sisters and brothers. May this period be one of reflection, both personal and community based. How can we show mercy? As a community, how can we show mercy towards other people, or other communities who do not think exactly like us?

Questioning ourselves: In preparing our hearts for the coming of the Lord, let us take a moment to reflect on all the violence that may live inside us. Then let us ask ourselves how to become an instrument of peace that will lead us to true forgiveness.
