



MONTHLY PRAYER INTENTIONS FROM THE ARCHBISHOP - January, 2016

“That sincere dialogue between men and women of different religions brings about peace and justice; and that, with the grace of the Holy Spirit, all Christians become concrete examples of true charity.”

Social conscience: We live in a multicultural society: many cultures, languages, and religions interact daily at school, at work, in our leisure activities, etc. How do we enter into a respectful dialogue with others? Sometimes the difference scares us, with our pre-conceived notions, our fear of the unknown, and our judgement of others. As an individual or a community, how can I learn to live with others?

Our faith response: Our Saviour invites us, on this *Extraordinary Year of Mercy*, to practice the latter by Christian charity with our brother and sister humans. As disciples of Jesus Christ, we are invited to defend human justice and solidarity. We must work with the rest of humanity, in order to promote the common good. The *Compendium of the Church’s Social Doctrine* asserts that: “Finally, this text is proposed in order to encourage dialogue with all those who sincerely work for the common good of humanity.”[1]

For a number of years, the executive has requested that parishioners come forward and join the Society. These requests have fallen on deaf ears leaving the Executive with the heavy responsibility of managing and co-ordinating the various Society events. So one may ask, what does the Society contribute to the Parish?

- ✓ Convenes or requests conveners for the St. Patrick and Christmas teas
- ✓ Over the years, purchased and stocked the kitchen with supplies that support our teas, suppers and other social events
- ✓ Managed the church kitchen, by purchasing supplies, ensuring the cleanliness of both the kitchen and fridges, as well as taking inventory of supplies on a regular basis
- ✓ Organizes one or two garage sales per year
- ✓ Prepares receptions for First Communion and Confirmation candidates
- ✓ Has masses said for deceased parishioners

Over the years, the Society has not only raised thousands of dollars in support of the Parish and its activities but its support for activities such as the teas were and are essential for connecting individuals and families with their fellow Parishioners. Parish life needs to be more than simply attending mass for 45 minutes on Sunday; supporting a re-constituted Society would be a positive move towards rejuvenating our parish life.

With this in mind, the Wardens will be looking at options and proposals with respect to the Society and will be seeking feedback and input from parishioners. The Wardens would also like to take the opportunity to thank Clare, Monique and Evelyn Robitaille for their years of dedication, devotion and contribution to the success of the Society.
