Emergency Relief for Syrian Refugees



DEVELOPMENT AND PEACE welcomes the announcement by the Federal Government to extend the period to match donations for emergency relief for Syrians until February 29th, 2016.

DEVELOPMENT AND PEACE has been responding to the crisis in Syria since the autumn of 2012 and has continued to increase its response as the situation has deteriorated. It is working in Turkey, Lebanon, Jordan and Macedonia, which are all hosting Syrian refugees, and in Syria where millions are impacted by the war. The organization has invested \$19.2 million in humanitarian aid and local peace initiatives that have helped over 500,000 Syrians. This amount includes \$17.5 million in funding from the Canadian government.

DEVELOPMENT AND PEACE is working in collaboration with local partner organizations, including Caritas Lebanon, Caritas Jordan and Jesuit Refugee Service. Since the launch of the matching fund in September, *DEVELOPMENT* AND PEACE has received \$2 million in donations that are admissible to be matched. The organization and its partners are grateful for the generosity of Canadians in receiving refugees here in Canada and in supporting much-needed aid in the region, and hope that Canadians will also push for a peaceful resolution to this enduring crisis.

News from the Transport Committee of Buckingham, Masson and Angers

Expanded service for bus line 97

The Transport Committee of Buckingham, Masson and Angers, is composed of different community stakeholders, including the *Papineau Health and Social Services Network*. The Committee's vision is to improve access to public transportation services over the whole territory.

The STO has announced that since December 21, 2015, the route for bus 97 has been modified to better serve the needs of residents. This decision is a result of recommendations provided by the Transport Committee and a petition from residents of the sector. Bus 97 now passes on Maclaren Street instead of passing on Dollard and Church as it did previously. As a result, seniors living in the Bowman sector now have access to public transport.
