

Lent will be early this year, which begins on Ash Wednesday February 10<sup>th</sup>. For the past few years, we have been rotating the Ash Wednesday celebration with St. Aloysius on either the Wednesday, or the Tuesday before Ash Wednesday.

This year, we will celebrate at Our Lady of Victory church on Tuesday, February 9<sup>th</sup> at 7:00 pm.

Please note that there will be two celebrations at St. Aloysius on Ash Wednesday, February 10<sup>th</sup> at 9:00 am as well as at 7:00 pm.

<u>Blessing of Throats</u> – February 3<sup>rd</sup> is the Feast of St. Blaise, the patron of those who suffer from diseases of the throat. Father Albanus will be offering the blessing of throats after our weekend Masses next weekend. The blessing of St. Blaise is a sign of our faith in God's protection and love for us and for the sick.

## **OUR LADY of VICTORY & ST. MALACHY NEWS**

<u>Lenten Project:</u> Sister Malinie has offered to lead a series of five sessions during Lent, one each week prior to Holy Week, on "Praying with Scripture". Each session will be a maximum of one hour. Before deciding on the timing of the sessions, i.e. which day of the week and at what time, we are asking parishioners to let the Parish Secretary know if they are interested in attending. All potential participants will be contacted regarding timing.

#### Is Our Lady of Victory a Small Church with a Big Heart?

In Father André's homily last week, he referred to compassion and talked about a small church with a big heart. So, how do we stack up in regard to this comment? Well, first of all, let's look at the self-help groups that we support. We provide the church hall at minimum cost to Alcoholics, Narcotics and Overeaters Anonymous. In talking to members of these groups, they often express their gratitude toward OLV and mention that there is no other location available in Buckingham that provides such an affordable location. It is important to note that many individuals in recovery have very little funds, so the groups have very little access to funds to pay rent. That is why OLV's rental policy is based on groups' capacity to pay.

OLV is now partnering with Relay for Life by providing the church basement free of charge for a fund-raising supper as they continue to raise funds in the battle to defeat cancer.

On a weekly basis, parishioners generously donate food for the local food bank and once a month, donate cereal bars in support of our local elementary school. In partnership with St. Malachy, parishioners generously support a special Christmas collection in support of the Lions Club Christmas Basket Campaign. Also in partnership with St. Malachy, parishioners addressed a needs list for our local school's Daily Bread Program by generously donating a wide range of goods. Also, as part of a partnership with the local English-speaking churches, OLV provides its hall once a month to support the activities of the Friday Night Buddies youth group.

Not a bad report card but the challenging question is: *can we do more?* For our 75<sup>th</sup> anniversary, should we undertake a parish project to show our big heart?
