Gospel Reading Mark 5.21-43

Background on the Gospel Reading



Mark brings two incidents together by inserting one (woman with hemorrhage) into the narrative of the other (Jairus' daughter). Both stories are gripping and moving, dealing as they do with people in extreme circumstances. The woman has a painful, debilitating illness (apparently incurable) that isolates her from the community because it is considered as making her "impure". Jairus' daughter, by the time Jesus reaches her, is already dead. As always, Jesus shows understanding and delicacy (especially in the case of the woman). And his authority over illness and death is supreme.

Note the stress that Jesus places on faith in both stories. To the woman he says: "Daughter, your faith has made you well". And to Jairus: "Do not fear, only believe". What does this say to you as you live your life as a Christian today?

OUR DIOCESE IS NOW CLASSIFIED IN THE YELLOW ZONE

The following changes are to be integrated to our Diocesan Protocol. All other directives remain in effect.

Places of worship

A maximum of 250 participants are allowed in a place of worship. The limit applies to the whole building.

A distance of at least two metres is maintained between people, even when they stay in their seat and do not move about, unless they are from the same private home or the equivalent.

A procedural mask or face covering must be worn. The procedural mask or face covering can be taken off when the person is in their seat, is silent or speaks only in a low voice.

Weddings and funerals in places of worship are limited to **50** people.

Concerning Funerals

An attendance register must be kept and a mask or face covering must be worn.

During the viewing of the body or ashes of the deceased, as well as during the expression of condolences to the next of kin, it is permitted to have a rotation of people inside the premises, provided that the number of people present at the same time never exceeds the maximum allowed.

THE VOICE OF THE CHILDREN

Many have expressed deep concern following the news of the discovery of the bodies of 215 Indian children buried near a residential school in British Columbia.

The Jesuit Forum in Toronto recently published a book Listening to Indigenous Voices. In its presentation it states:

"To engage in this process, we need to listen deeply to what Indigenous Peoples are saying, open ourselves to be transformed by their words, and act based on what they are telling us so that we can begin to address injustices, heal relationships, and bring about a post-colonial Canada."

The book provides a method for 11 group sessions to do just that: listen, open ourselves, act.
