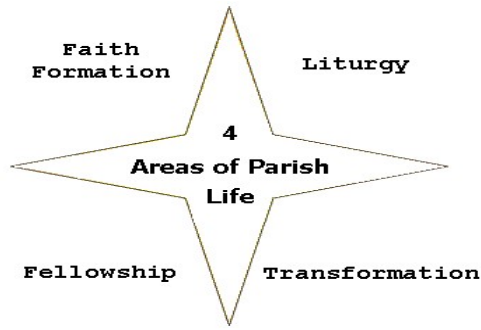

490 Snow suits for children of the Lièvre:

For the past 12 years, “*Garder les enfants au chaud*” (Keeping Kids Warm) has been providing winter clothing to children in need.

To date, the demand has already reached 295, a record number compared to last fall. “This year, four families are living on the street in Buckingham, which is unusual for the community,” notes Sébastien Joncas, the founder of *Garder les enfants au chaud*. All young people are invited to come and get what they need to keep warm next season. This includes residents of the Lièvre territory as far as Val-des-Bois, and then eastward to Thurso.

People are invited to donate warm clothing at Fleur de Guy, 746 avenue de Buckingham, or at the Maison de la famille Vallée-de-la-Lièvre at 321 avenue de Buckingham. In addition, all monetary donations will be accepted. The fundraising campaign hopes to raise no less than \$16,000.
