Update on our Community Involvement

La Mie de l'entraide has been extremely busy during November and December. There have been numerous food drives which helps to provide extras when preparing Christmas food requirements for the needy population. Statistics indicate a 100% increase since 2019.

"After a very busy period, the elves in our team need to recharge their batteries. La Mie will therefore be closed from noon on December 23rd. Back to regular hours on Monday, January 3rd. Please note that food will be available in the outside refrigerator for those who need it."

Buckingham Lions Club - the 4th annual breakfast at Resto-Bar Le Buck raised over \$18,000. This amount added to the total amount of funds previously raised over the past year. The Club recently distributed over 150 Christmas baskets to needy population of the region.

In addition, Our Lady of Victory provides support to Alcoholics Anonymous and Narcotics Anonymous on a weekly basis.

COVID-19 UPDATE FOR OLV & ST. MALACHY CHURCHES

Once again, COVID is threatening the lives of many elderly and vulnerable people, as well as the integrity of our health care system.

Consequently, the Quebec government has introduced new measures to fight the virus. The one change that will dramatically have an impact on our community is the requirement to provide a vaccination passport to attend mass celebrations. This new measure will become effective as of December 20, 2021. Other public health measures will remain in place. **Given that this is the first time we will be doing this verification process on Christmas morning, parishioners are being asked to come to mass a little earlier to avoid a bottleneck at the entrance.**
